HLC Youth Camp – Right Now


During the week of 24-28 November, the oldest students at Harvest Learning Center enjoyed a five-day camp with their classmates. The theme, "Right Now," was chosen to help these students to break cycles of procrastination in their lives and to encourage them to make important decisions in their lives.

The first 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ days were extra special because the students had the opportunity to stay at the nearby Khon Kaen Zoo. At this location the students enjoyed the time they were given to connect with God in nature. They also learned and practiced basic wilderness survival skills in nature, including food production and food preparation. One of the highlights at the zoo was the obstacle course, with many of the obstacles presenting challenges that required the students to draw on all their courage, strength, and determination.

The final 2 days were spent camping out at Harvest Learning Center. During these two days the students were challenged and equipped to visit and encourage one of Khon Kaen's poorest villages. Upon their return from this visit, many of the students said that this was the first time they had done something like this. Many of them reported that they had enjoyed the opportunity to share their hope in God and to pray with villagers. Only time will reveal if this camp succeeded in teaching our students the value and the importance of focusing on the opportunities of life that are before them "right now."
