## FROM THE HARVEST FIELD...

Dear friends and supporters,

As the world seems to be spinning out of control, our sovereign Lord reigns.

In January 2026, we launched an exciting new initiative—the **Harvest Capacity Development Farm**. This project was born out of a vision to equip children and families with the skills, character, and resilience needed for the days ahead. This farm can become a living classroom, a livelihood engine and a character-shaping community all in one.

For the first phase, we set a goal of raising 168,706 SGD to build a security fence, to purchase two pre-fabricated Thai houses, and to lay concrete foundations for both houses. **We are overjoyed to inform you that the full amount has been raised and we were able to pay all our bills by the end of March/early April for the completion of this first phase. Thank you for standing with us—your support has made this possible.**



As we move forward, we are seeking the Lord's guidance on how to fully utilize this farm as a place of transformation. Our vision is to train children and families to live resiliently in a time when resources are becoming increasingly limited.

More than just teaching practical skills, we are building a community grounded in faith and purpose. Here, individuals will grow in character, learn godly values, and discover the joy of serving others. At the same time, they will be equipped with essential life skills such as agriculture, food production, sewing, equipment repair, woodworking, and even computer and AI skills.

## SPECIAL REPORT: Arise and Shine – Passing on Hope in the Deep South

During the flood crisis that struck Yala, Pattani, and Hat Yai in late November 2025, the hardship extended beyond the rising water levels due to the inability of vulnerable groups who could not easily assist themselves. Thanks to the generous donations of our donors, we were able to distribute aid through a **door-to-door** approach within our network's working areas. This ensured that no one was left behind and that your contributions reached those with genuine needs.

### Operational Summary (As of March 21, 2026)

We have allocated budgets and assistance divided into emergency and rehabilitation phases as follows:

#### 1. Hat Yai Area: Ongoing Care: Providing continuous support for 30 families of widows and orphans (representing 60% of the mission).

- **Relief Bags and Food:** Distributed 8,188 items in collaboration with church networks and various organizations between November 25 and December 10, 2025.



- **Sangangam Kitchen:** In collaboration with Sangangam Church, a free food kitchen for the impoverished was opened from mid-January to the present. This kitchen served approximately 300 people in the first month and 750 people in the second month.



## 2. Pattani Area (Thung Yang Daeng Community)

Focusing on a sensitive "Red Zone" area, specifically the Islam Pracha Songkhro Kindergarten, supporting 130 families that asked for help.

- **Relief Supplies:** Provided baby diapers and basic household medicines.



- **Post-Flood Visit:** Conducted a site visit after the water receded to discuss future disaster preparedness plans.

## 3. Yala Area

Targeted the Talat Kao (Old Market) community, a red zone for drug trade and use, and the Ban Kampan community, which faces most severe annual flooding.

- **Smile Sharing Bags:** Distributed milk cartons, nutritious snacks, and drawing kits with bags. This was conducted twice for 20 participants each under the "Warm Family, Peaceful Community" project for youth in Talat Kao. The bags have food and drinks which the kids will bring to the bed-ridden elderly in their own community.



- **Relief Bags and Blankets:** Provided medicine, rice, and blankets to 50 families in the Talat Kao community and 20 families in the Ban Kampan community, focusing on the elderly and bedridden patients.



- **Stories from the Field**

"Thank you for coming to help us. I couldn't bear to just watch; this is our community, our children, and our neighbors." — **Ka Ni**, Ban Kampan Community

"I want to see drug suppression; the children are all addicted now. Even my own son is addicted. Since he separated from his wife, I stay here to support my granddaughter who has problems with her father." — **Teacher Amphan**, Community Leader in Talat Kao

- **Rehabilitation and Future Plans**

The recovery work in the deep South is being done by a network of individuals, church groups and non-profit organizations. We are honored to partner with them as the focus is on supporting local communities through the initiative **"Healing to Build Resilience in Families."** The aim is to foster a compassionate community that is resilient and ready to face any form of disaster by looking after one another, especially among the vulnerable and the poor.


Your support brings real change to those we serve. We appreciate your generous support. Please continue to pray for us. Because of you, we will be able to continue to make a meaningful impact and bring hope to many needy families and communities.
